Circumstances of Incident

On July 11, 2019, at 1:01 pm, Officers Sean Noltemeyer, Todd Eagon, Matthew Caldwell, John Coaty, and Rodney Reed responded to 1667 Genessee Avenue on a gun run (Incident #190570555, p. 28). During their investigation, the officers spoke to the caller, Deborah Saenz, and the suspect, Marcos Solis III. The officers left the scene around 1:24 pm, and Officer Reed completed a Domestic Dispute-No Violence report (Report #190570555, p. 66-69). At 1:33 pm, a 911 hang-up call was received from Ms. Saenz's phone number, but when the call taker attempted a call-back, there was no answer. Zone 4 Dispatcher Laura Thomas did not air the additional information, and subsequently, the 911 hang-up call did not receive a police response.

On July 12, 2019, at 9:55 am, Mr. Solis reported he had shot Ms. Saenz, and she was pronounced deceased soon after that. Deputy Chief Timothy Becker, the Investigative Subdivision Deputy Chief, emailed Zone 4 Commander Robert Sagle and alerted him of Ms. Saenz's homicide and the fact that officers had been at the residence the previous day. Deputy Chief Becker suggested that Commander Sagle have someone look into whether or not the officers had missed any opportunities to intervene. Commander Sagle forwarded the email to Lieutenant LuEllen Kuykendoll.

On July 13, 2019, Lieutenant Kuykendoll spoke to Commander Sagle multiple times. Lieutenant Kuykendoll reviewed the Body-Worn Camera (BWC) video of all the officers who responded to the scene, the CAD data, and the report. Lieutenant Kuykendoll had the report reclassified as a Miscellaneous Incident, discussed the situation with Officer Reed, and had him change the report narrative. Lieutenant Kuykendoll forwarded a letter to Commander Sagle, which documented what she discovered and how she

handled the situation.

On September 11, 2019, Attorney Joel Newby III emailed Columbus City Attorney Zach Klein regarding the death of Ms. Saenz on behalf of her surviving family and alleged "wanton disregard of police policy" regarding the officers' investigation of a domestic violence call. Subsequently, Deputy Chief Bash directed the Internal Affairs Bureau to initiate an investigation into the actions of the officers and the amending of the report.

Allegation I

Officers Matthew Caldwell and Todd Eagon failed to share relevant information with other officers.

Allegation II

Officers John Coaty, Sean Noltemeyer, and Rodney Reed failed to complete a proper investigation.

Allegation III

Lieutenant LuEllen Kuykendoll instructed Officer Rodney Reed to amend Report #190570555, which was completed.

Allegation IV

Officer Rodney Reed added inaccurate information to a police report.

Allegation V

Lieutenant Luellen Kuykendoll incorrectly reclassified a report.

Allegation VI

Lieutenant LuEllen Kuykendoll failed to ensure the report Officer Rodney Reed completed was accurate.

Response to Allegation(s)

Officer COATY, JOHN M #2224 - focus officer:

On October 23, 2019, this investigator and Sergeant Scott Gaton #5192, interviewed Officer John Coaty #2224, at the Internal Affairs Bureau. Before the interview, Officer Coaty watched Body-Worn Camera (BWC) video from the incident recorded by Officers Noltemeyer and Caldwell. This investigator did not locate any BWC video of this incident recorded by Officer Coaty, although there were other recordings from his BWC on that date. Officer Coaty said he was surprised he did not activate his BWC because he usually uses it. Officer Coaty said, "I obviously forgot." Officer Coaty noted, at some point after the incident, Sergeant Balmert informally addressed the fact he had not used his BWC during the run.

Officer Coaty said, when the gun run was aired, he and Officer Reed were busy a couple of blocks away, on another run. Officer Coaty said the dispatcher sent 5 precinct officers, even though it was on 2 precinct because all the 2 precinct officers were busy. Officer Coaty said he and Officer Reed hurried because "it sounded like not a so good run [sic], that we probably needed to get over there because it was on us." Officer Coaty said they finished their current run and marked on the gun run. Officer Coaty said, when they arrived, the officers on the scene had already separated the male and female. Officer Coaty said a 5 precinct officer was speaking to a male (Mr. Solis), who was seated at a picnic table outside the residence, and he believed another officer was talking to the female (Ms. Saenz) inside the home.

Officer Coaty said he stayed with the officer who was speaking to Mr. Solis and did not enter the residence or talk to Ms. Saenz. Officer Coaty said he figured if someone were going to jail, it would probably be Mr. Solis, because he believed the run stated something like, "The boyfriend was threatening someone with a gun." Officer Coaty said Mr. Solis was very quiet and did not make any allegations against Ms. Saenz. Officer Coaty said he had a small amount of direct conversation with Mr. Solis after he noticed Mr. Solis had some MS13 gang tattoos. Officer Coaty said he asked Mr. Solis where he got them, and Mr. Solis started talking about having been in prison. Officer Coaty said it seemed like Mr. Solis might have been "high."

Officer Coaty said there was no probable cause to arrest anyone while he was at the scene, and he did not infer from any of the other officers that they believed there was probable cause. Officer Coaty said he did not notice any injuries on either party.

Officer Coaty said he offered to take the police report since it was on 2 precinct, but because he already had two other reports he needed to finish, Officer Reed stated he would complete the report.

Officer Coaty said he did not remember hearing anyone ask about the gun. This investigator asked Officer Coaty why he didn't ask about the gun. Officer Coaty answered, "I really don't know. I mean, those guys had already talked to them. I figured they had already been there (for) sometime, and I wasn't going to just come in on the middle of something, and throw myself in there, and start completely taking over when I'm like, one of the last guys there." Officer Coaty said he did not think he ran any LEADS or warrant checks on the parties. Officer Coaty said he assumed the officers at the scene ran LEADS and warrant checks on the individuals before he arrived.

Officer Coaty said when the officers left the residence, they did not linger in the area, talking to one another. Officer Coaty said he did not know a 911 hang-up call was received from Ms. Saenz's phone after he left or that additional information had been added to the run.

This investigator asked Officer Coaty, after reviewing the BWC video, if there was anything he thought he should have done that he hadn't or anything he would do differently. Officer Coaty answered, "Based on what I knew at the time, no. I mean obviously, after the fact, but based on what I knew at the time, I, I mean, we do this a lot. Where we separate a party, somebody talks to them, (and) somebody talks to the other party and then you come together and say this is what I've got and this is what I got out of this end, and then together you try and put the pieces together on whose going to go to jail."

This investigator asked Officer Coaty what information the officers who were already at the scene provided to Officer Reed since Officer Reed was completing the report. Officer Coaty said the officers told Officer Reed the male and female argued about the trap house down the street.

Officer CALDWELL, MATTHEW #2619 - focus officer:

On October 23, 2019, this investigator and Sergeant Gaton, interviewed Officer Matthew Caldwell #2619, at the Internal Affairs Bureau. Before the interview, Officer Caldwell watched his BWC video.

Officer Caldwell said, on July 11, 2019, he worked as "Shot-Spotter Special." Officer Caldwell said part of the instructions he received about working "Shot-Spotter Special" was "not to get tied up on too much stuff. Be available, basically for shot-spotter." Officer Caldwell said when the run aired, he was clear and a couple of blocks away. Officer Caldwell said he thought he could go "help out," so he asked to be added to the

run. Officer Caldwell said he was the first officer at the scene and observed a broken window on the front of the residence. Officer Caldwell said he did not hear any sounds coming from inside the house, so he peered through the broken window. Officer Caldwell said he called out to the people inside, but the house remained quiet. Officer Caldwell said Ms. Saenz then appeared by the window. Officer Caldwell said he saw Ms. Saenz crying and attempting to clean up the broken glass. Officer Caldwell said he spoke to Ms. Saenz through the window, but that was the only time he directly talked to her.

Officer Caldwell said, after the 5 precinct officers arrived, they made contact with Ms. Saenz. Officer Caldwell said the officers separated the two parties; Officer Noltemeyer spoke to the male outside the residence, while another officer (Officer Eagon) talked to the female inside the apartment. Officer Caldwell said he did not pay much attention to what the officers were asking because he was looking around the area. Officer Caldwell said he was there "for support" and did not do any investigative work. Officer Caldwell said he stood by and made sure everyone was safe until the officers left, and let the dispatched officers conduct the investigation.

This investigator asked Officer Caldwell why he walked around inside the residence when he entered. Officer Caldwell answered, "Because it was originally a gun run, so I was just seeing if there was a gun laying around. Basically, doing a protective sweep." Officer Caldwell said he did not find a gun, but saw a gun case lying on the bed. This investigator asked Officer Caldwell if seeing the gun case raised his level of suspicion, and he replied, "It did. It did." Officer Caldwell said he alerted one of the other officers about the gun case and visually scanned the area for the gun. Officer Caldwell said he did not do an in-depth search because the officers did not possess a search warrant. Officer Caldwell said he did not know if any of the officers asked the individuals, "Where is the gun?" Sergeant Gaton asked Officer Caldwell if there was a reason why he did not ask the female, "Hey, I see an open gun case. Where's this gun at?" Officer Caldwell replied, "Valid point." Officer Caldwell said there was no particular reason he did not ask about it, and "in retrospect, yeah, I should of [sic]."

This investigator asked Officer Caldwell if it appeared to him, as he walked around the house, that someone had been throwing things, and he answered, "Except for the broken glass, not really." This investigator asked Officer Caldwell what observations he had made regarding the damage to the drywall in the house. Officer Caldwell said he did not recall seeing any damaged drywall; he said he must have passed by it and not noticed it. Officer Caldwell said it was not uncommon for a house in Linden to have damaged drywall.

Officer Caldwell said he did not observe any injuries on either party. Officer Caldwell said he did not know if any of the items Mr. Solis alleged Ms. Saenz threw at him, had struck him. Officer Caldwell said he did not ask or remember anyone else asking that

question. Officer Caldwell said, "I just thought she was back and forth" and described her demeanor as "upset."

Officer Caldwell said the other officers told Officer Reed that the couple argued about the trap house down the street. This investigator asked Officer Caldwell if the officers had any conversation after the BWCs were turned off. Officer Caldwell said he did not remember the officers talking after they left the house. Officer Caldwell said he went to his car and drove away.

Officer Caldwell said the information on the run did not coincide with the information the officers gathered at the scene. Officer Caldwell said people sometimes say things when they call the police to initiate a faster response. Officer Caldwell antidotally added officers frequently get dispatched on runs and discover the CAD contains information about things that didn't happen. In this instance, Officer Caldwell said it seemed like both Ms. Saenz and Mr. Solis were being deceptive. Officer Caldwell said he was not sure who to believe. Officer Caldwell said he did not know what had happened, but if he had to guess, the couple argued; they had thrown some things, and perhaps the male had broken the window. Officer Caldwell said he did not know if any of the officers asked either party if there had been a physical altercation, if she had been threatened, or hear them ask about the gun. Officer Caldwell said he did not know if any of the officers asked the parties questions to establish the relationship between Mr. Solis and Ms. Saenz.

Officer Caldwell said the officers' investigation did not establish "PC" to arrest anyone. As the officers were leaving, Officer Caldwell said he observed Ms. Saenz crying but did not say anything to her; he did not remember any of the other officers saying anything either. This investigator asked Officer Caldwell if he thought there had been some resolution to the situation when the officers were leaving, and he answered, "Honestly, I don't know. Well, obviously, the perfect resolution would have been having them separate, something like that. I guess at that turn, you know, I think we could have done more to separate the two, but other than that, I don't know." Officer Caldwell said he did not know if the officers suggested the couple temporarily separate.

Officer Caldwell said he did not know if any of the officers conducted a lethality assessment, and he did not hear any discussion about giving a lethality assessment. Officer Caldwell said he did not believe any of the officers followed-up with the neighbors to attempt to identify witnesses or obtain additional information. Officer Caldwell said he did not see anyone give Ms. Saenz any crime victim's information, the guide to protection orders, the report number, or refer her to Choices.

Officer Caldwell said he did not conduct any LEADS or warrant checks on the involved individuals, and he did not know if anyone else did. Officer Caldwell clarified the

notation on the run, which indicated he ran someone in LEADS, occurred after he had left the scene and was not associated with the gun run (p. 36).

Officer Caldwell said he was not aware a 911 hang-up call was received from Ms. Saenz's phone number after the officers left or that additional information had been added to the run.

This investigator asked Officer Caldwell if there was anything he thought he should have done that he did not do. Officer Caldwell answered, "I think I definitely should have separated them. At least given her a ride somewhere if she wanted to go somewhere. I think that is the one thing I should have done."

Officer Caldwell said no one followed up with him after the incident or discussed it with him.

Officer EAGON, TODD A #240 - focus officer:

On October 30, 2019, this investigator and Sergeant Gaton, interviewed Officer Todd Eagon #240, at the Internal Affairs Bureau. Before the interview, Officer Eagon reviewed his BWC video.

This investigator asked Officer Eagon about the scene and what evidence he observed. Officer Eagon said he did not see any evidence inside the house, which indicated there had been a struggle. Officer Eagon said it did not appear things had been thrown. Officer Eagon stated the window had been recently broken, but he did not recall if there was glass on the floor. This investigator asked Officer Eagon about the damaged drywall visible in the BWC video. Officer Eagon said he probably saw the drywall damage, but it did not stick out to him as abnormal because many of the houses he enters have damaged drywall. Officer Eagon said he did not recall noticing anything, which indicated it was fresh damage.

Officer Eagon said this was his first encounter with Ms. Saenz. Officer Eagon said some of Ms. Saenz's responses seemed like she might be a "16B," and when Officer Reed arrived, Officer Reed indicated he had past interactions with her and that she was a "16B."

Officer Eagon said he spoke to Ms. Saenz away from Mr. Solis so she could tell her side of the story, but she would not fully divulge what happened, even though he asked her two or three times. Officer Eagon said Ms. Saenz told him she was afraid of Mr. Solis, but "...if she was really that scared of him, I think she would have told me (what happened), being separated from Marco [sic], and it was just me and her in the house initially, with him outside. So if you are really that scared of him, why not talk to the officer that's inside with you, alone, and there was no way Marco [sic] was going to get

back into the house while we were there, to do anything, and he was outside, and he would have been a code three outside and taken to jail for Domestic Violence. But she would never tell me anything like that." Officer Eagon said he thought Ms. Saenz was more worried about the trap house than about Mr. Solis because that is what she kept talking about it.

Officer Eagon said he asked Ms. Saenz what happened to the window, and she told him Mr. Solis locked her out of the house, and she broke the window to get inside to protect her dogs. Officer Eagon said he asked Ms. Saenz specifically if she broke the window to protect the dogs from Mr. Solis, and she answered, "No." Officer Eagon could not provide a reason he did not ask Ms. Saenz if Mr. Solis had threatened her or the dogs, with or without a gun. Officer Eagon said he found it "a little odd" that she would break a window to protect the dogs, but because it was her apartment, she could break the window. Officer Eagon agreed Ms. Saenz would logically have been protecting the dogs from either Mr. Solis or each other because there was no one else there.

Officer Eagon said because Ms. Saenz did not make any allegations of threats or violence, he assumed the couple had a verbal argument. Officer Eagon said he asked Ms. Saenz outside if Mr. Solis had assaulted her, but he did not hear her response because Mr. Solis exited the residence, and he shifted his focus. Once they were inside, Officer Eagon said he did not specifically ask Ms. Saenz again if she had been assaulted. Officer Eagon said there was no doubt that Ms. Saenz and Mr. Solis argued, but he did not believe she told him the whole story. Officer Eagon said he did not ask Ms. Saenz about the information that was in the CAD.

After Officer Caldwell found the gun case, Officer Eagon said he wondered where the gun was, but he did not look around for it because he did not have the legal grounds to search for it. This investigator asked Officer Eagon why he did not ask Ms. Saenz where the gun was, especially since they were dispatched on a gun run. Officer Eaton said, "There was no reason. I just didn't do it." Officer Eagon said he recalled hearing Ms. Saenz mention that Mr. Solis had just gotten out of prison. Still, it did not occur to him at the time that he might not be able to legally possess a weapon due to a felony conviction.

Officer Eagon said he did not see any signs of injury on Ms. Saenz, and he did not notice any marks on Mr. Solis. This investigator replayed the BWC video from when Mr. Solis exited the residence and pointed out what appeared to be a fresh scrape on his chest. Officer Eagon said, "I see it now, but I didn't notice it right then." Officer Eagon said, as Mr. Solis was coming outside, he focused his attention inside the house to see if anyone else was present.

This investigator asked Officer Eagon questions about what information he shared with Officer Reed and the other officers. Officer Eagon said he did not believe he mentioned

to Officer Reed, or any of the other officers at the scene, that there was an open gun case in the bedroom, without a gun in it. Officer Eagon said he did not believe he ever gave Officer Reed any information about what Ms. Saenz had told him. Officer Eagon said he assumed Ms. Saenz would tell Officer Reed more than she told him. Officer Eagon said the officers did not confer with one another about what evidence they had to decide a course of action.

This investigator asked Officer Eagon if he attempted to locate any witnesses. He said he had not, and he did not see any officer follow-up with the neighbors. Officer Eagon said he did not conduct a lethality assessment or consider doing one because he believed they had just had a "17A." Officer Eagon said he did not run either of the parties in LEADS or do warrant checks on them. Officer Eagon said he did not know if anyone else conducted LEADS or warrant checks.

Officer Eagon said he was unable to determine if there had been any violence based upon his observations, and he did not have probable cause to arrest anyone. Officer Eagon said neither party made any allegations of violence. Officer Eagon said the officers would have arrested Mr. Solis for Domestic Violence if Ms. Saenz told them he assaulted her, and there was a gun involved. This investigator asked Officer Eagon what types of things he was looking for as evidence to develop probable cause. Officer Eagon said he tried to get Ms. Saenz's statement. Officer Eagon said, "I cannot establish probable cause by the way the apartment looks. I cannot arrest him because there is an overturned lamp, or she is, her statements have to, you know, establish the probable cause for the arrest."

Officer Eagon said after the officers cleared the run, they got into their cruisers and left. He said they did not stay and talk to one another. Officer Eagon said he did not respond to the 911 hang-up call, and did not know additional information was added to the run.

This investigator asked Officer Eagon, "Looking back at the run, is there anything you feel you should have done that you did not do?" Officer Eagon answered, "No."

Officer Eagon said after the incident, no one followed up with him to discuss what happened.

Officer NOLTEMEYER, SEAN S #1434 - focus officer:

On November 7, 2019, this investigator conducted an in-person interview with Officer Noltemeyer. Officer Noltemeyer stated he and his partner, Officer Eagon, responded to 2 precinct on a gun run. Officer Noltemeyer said Ms. Saenz told them she was upset about a trap house, and it had nothing to do with Mr. Solis. Officer Noltemeyer said he did not believe Ms. Saenz was truthful about why she had called. Officer Noltemeyer

said Ms. Saenz had a "hysterical tone" and seemed unwilling to say that Mr. Solis had done anything, so he tried to "dispel" what she said by the tone and inflection in his voice when he responded to her.

Officer Noltemeyer said Ms. Saenz's demeanor indicated she did not want the officers to conduct any further investigation or speak with Mr. Solis. Officer Noltemeyer said he noticed Ms. Saenz had positioned herself, so her body was blocking the doorway to the residence. Officer Noltemeyer said he instructed Ms. Saenz to step forward and away from the door, partially for her safety, but also to create a path so the officers could make contact with Mr. Solis. Officer Noltemeyer said he did not observe any broken glass and initially did not know that the front window was broken until he heard Ms. Saenz and Officer Caldwell refer to it. Officer Noltemeyer said he could not recall what Ms. Saenz said about the window.

Officer Noltemeyer said he did not hear or retain everything that Ms. Saenz said when she initially approached them because he was concerned if there was a person with a gun. Officer Noltemeyer said he was thinking about Ms. Saenz's safety, wondering if they were going to have a gunfight, wondering what was behind the door and what was going to happen. Officer Noltemeyer said, while he was focused on all of these other things, he might have missed hearing something that was said.

Officer Noltemeyer said he verified it was Ms. Saenz's residence and obtained her consent to go inside to make contact with Mr. Solis. Officer Noltemeyer said he opened the front door and observed an open area with minimal furniture and some dogs running around, then shifted his focus to Mr. Solis. Officer Noltemeyer said he made contact with Mr. Solis, checked him for weapons, and positioned him, so he did not have access to any weapons. After the officers had ensured the situation was safe, Officer Noltemeyer said they began their investigation. Officer Noltemeyer said they separated the individuals to gather both sides of the story. Officer Noltemeyer said Officer Eagon went inside the residence to speak to Ms. Saenz, while he remained outside with Mr. Solis and inquired about what had happened. Officer Noltemeyer said Mr. Solis explained that he had come home late the previous night or that same morning. Officer Noltemeyer said Mr. Solis indicated he and Ms. Saenz had been arguing since he returned home.

As Officer Noltemeyer interviewed Mr. Solis, he said he discreetly walked around Mr. Solis and checked him for injuries. Officer Noltemeyer said because Mr. Solis was only wearing gym shorts, he was able to make a reasonably thorough analysis of Mr. Solis' body. Officer Noltemeyer said he devoted extra attention to Mr. Solis' neck, hands, fingernails, and knuckles and looked for offensive or defensive injuries, but he did not observe anything. Officer Noltemeyer said he did not ask Mr. Solis if he was injured because there was no reason for him to believe Mr. Solis had been harmed. Officer Noltemeyer said Mr. Solis did not seem to be inebriated, he was talking, walking, and

did not complain of any injuries, and he was an adult and could have voiced if he had a problem. Officer Noltemeyer said he has found that if he asks someone if they are injured during a domestic violence investigation, depending upon the person's level of knowledge, it can prompt them to make a false allegation.

Officer Noltemeyer said Mr. Solis mumbled a lot of unclear things, but his demeanor was very calm. Officer Noltemeyer said he obtained Mr. Solis' information and noted his tattoos for later identification and gang affiliations. Officer Noltemeyer said Mr. Solis projected his voice towards Officer Coaty and was speaking at a low volume, so he may not have heard or retained everything that Mr. Solis said.

Officer Noltemeyer said after Officer Reed spoke to Ms. Saenz, he told Officer Reed that Mr. Solis had indicated there had been an argument between him and Ms. Saenz. But Officer Noltemeyer said Officer Eagon and Officer Reed told him it was not a domestic violence incident, so he revised his opinion of the situation. Officer Noltemeyer said he did not tell Officer Reed that Mr. Solis had taken a pill the night before because he did not recall hearing him say that. Officer Noltemeyer said he did not say to Officer Reed that Mr. Solis had stated Ms. Saenz had been upset and had been throwing things at him. Officer Noltemeyer said he did not know if he heard Mr. Solis make that statement because he was mumbling, and it was difficult to comprehend what he was saying. Officer Noltemeyer said he did not tell Officer Reed that Ms. Saenz had stated she had broken the window because he did not hear her say that.

Officer Noltemeyer said Officer Reed indicated Ms. Saenz was a "B" (mentally disturbed person) and her behavior made it seem she was either mentally ill, high on drugs, or a combination of the two because her conduct did not seem to align with the reason they had been dispatched. Officer Noltemeyer said because Ms. Saenz kept bringing up the trap house, he thought perhaps she and her boyfriend were involved with it or were using drugs. Officer Noltemeyer said, based upon his limited observations, Mr. Solis' credibility seemed better than Ms. Saenz's.

This investigator asked Officer Noltemeyer after Mr. Solis indicated there had been an argument, what questions he asked to determine if there had been an assault. Officer Noltemeyer said he did not ask Mr. Solis if Ms. Saenz had assaulted or threatened him or if he had assaulted or threatened her. Officer Noltemeyer said when Mr. Solis was removed from the house, two officers had remained with him, and he was not free to leave. Officer Noltemeyer said he waited for more information before he questioned Mr. Solis because he thought it could be considered a custodial interrogation, and Miranda might apply. This investigator asked Officer Noltemeyer why he did not ask Mr. Solis about the gun, and he answered, "I did not find any credibility possibly, based on what I had learned from Officer Eagon coming out. If, if I had thought that anything was going on, if she would have continued to allege something, we would

have acted upon it." Officer Noltemeyer said he was unaware the officers had located an open gun case inside the residence.

Officer Noltemeyer said he did not challenge Ms. Saenz about her statements being inconsistent with the CAD data because he figured Officer Reed and Officer Eagon would do that when they spoke to her. Officer Noltemeyer said, when he left the scene, it seemed like the situation had been resolved. Officer Noltemeyer said it appeared to him, based upon what Officer Reed said to Mr. Solis, that Ms. Saenz and Mr. Solis might have both had a problem with people at the trap house. Officer Noltemeyer said he thought there might have been an incident at the trap house or that something was going on in connection to it. As the officers walked back to the cruiser, Officer Noltemeyer said he asked Officer Reed where the alleged trap house was located and what had been going on with it. Officer Noltemeyer said Officer Reed briefly told him about it, but he did not hear the full account because he and Officer Eagon needed to leave. Officer Noltemeyer said they did not discuss anything else related to the run that was not recorded by the BWC.

Officer Noltemeyer said he did not conduct LEADS or warrant checks on either of the parties and assumed that Officer Coaty was going to do it. Officer Noltemeyer said he did not know if any of the officers conducted warrant checks on the individuals.

Officer Noltemeyer said he did not follow-up with the neighbors to attempt to locate witnesses because in specific parts of the city when people want to step-up as a witness, they will motion for the officers, call the police, or will come to the door to let the officers know that they have information to report. Officer Noltemeyer said if none of these things occur, he is cautious about approaching someone else who lives within proximity because it can create the perception that they are a "snitch" and cause them problems. Officer Noltemeyer said after their investigation, no allegations of criminal conduct had been made, so there was no reason to contact anyone else. Also, Officer Noltemeyer said there was a reason to believe Mr. Solis might be involved with drugs and have a gang affiliation based on his tattoos, so he thought to contact neighbors might have put them in danger.

Officer Noltemeyer said he assumed Officer Reed provided Ms. Saenz with the report number and provided her with information about resources available to her. Officer Noltemeyer said something Officer Reed said made him think it was suggested that the couple should voluntarily separate, but Officer Reed's comments about avoiding the trap house made him believe the problem might be at the trap house.

Officer Noltemeyer said he was unaware of the additional information that had been added to the run regarding the 911 hang-up call, and he did not respond to it. This investigator asked Officer Noltemeyer if he thought there was anything that he should have done that he did not do. Officer Noltemeyer said there were things he could have

done, but nothing else was required. Officer Noltemeyer said he did not have probable cause to arrest anyone because no witness or victim alleged any crime.

Officer Noltemeyer said after the run was over, no one followed up with him to discuss what had happened.

Officer REED, RODNEY D #363 - focus officer:

On November 1, 2019, this investigator and Sergeant Gaton, interviewed Officer Rodney Reed #363, at the Internal Affairs Bureau. Before the interview, Officer Reed reviewed his BWC video.

Officer Reed said 5 precinct was initially dispatched to the run because he and Officer Coaty were "tied up" on another run. When they cleared, Officer Reed said he and Officer Coaty went to the domestic, "to take the code 3, or the paper, or whatever." Officer Reed said he read the CAD data on the way to the run. This investigator asked Officer Reed if he knew the couple had been arguing, and he replied, "As per the run, yes."

Officer Reed said he was outside initially, with the male half, and then went inside the home. Officer Reed said when he entered, Officer Eagon was speaking with Ms. Saenz. Officer Reed said he remembered Ms. Saenz; based upon their previous encounter, he opined she was a "16B." This investigator asked Officer Reed what made him believe Ms. Saenz was a "16B." Officer Reed said, during his prior contact with her, she was "hysterical" and "not like a normal, functioning person." Officer Reed described Ms. Saenz as "overdramatic." [sic] Officer Reed said Ms. Saenz was "severely adamant" another location was a trap house, and she wanted something done about it immediately, "or else her world was going to come to an end." This investigator asked Officer Reed if he asked Ms. Saenz why she was so upset about the trap house, and he answered, "No, didn't have a chance." There were no BWC videos from any of the officers that responded to the trap house run.

Sergeant Gaton asked Officer Reed if it seemed like the house was in disarray, and Officer Reed replied, "The only thing I noticed about the house was there was like no furniture." Officer Reed said he did not notice the broken window in the living room and could not recall if there was broken glass on the floor. Officer Reed said he did not see any damaged drywall either.

Officer Reed said he did not recall asking Ms. Saenz if she was hurt because he did not have the first contact with her. Officer Reed said, "From what I could see of her, she had no marks, or bruising, or any blood." Officer Reed said he did not notice any injuries on Mr. Solis during their brief contact, and none of the other officers told him Mr. Solis was injured.

This investigator asked Officer Reed what information he obtained from the other officers since he was completing the report. Officer Reed said Officer Eagon told him, "Trap house. It's all about the trap house." Officer Reed said the only other piece of information he received was from Officer Noltemeyer, who said, "report only" and provided a paper with the male's information to Officer Coaty.

Officer Reed said he did not hear Officer Caldwell say, "I've got a 33," and neither of the officers told him about the gun case. Officer Reed said he did not ask Ms. Saenz about the gun, even though he was dispatched on a gun run because "she said it was all about the trap house." Officer Reed said he could not recall if he asked Ms. Saenz if Mr. Solis had assaulted or threatened her, but none of the other officers told him they had asked her either question. Officer Reed said after the officers walked away from the house, no one gave him any additional information.

Sergeant Gaton asked Officer Reed what he based his first report on, and he answered, "I did good faith. The officers outside was [sic] handling that situation, getting his information, his side of the story." Officer Reed said he also personally spoke to the female inside, who told him it was about the trap house, and he had gotten the same information from Officer Eagon. Officer Reed said he thought Ms. Saenz and Mr. Solis argued about the trap house.

Sergeant Gaton read the original narrative to Officer Reed, which stated, "RP states on above date and time her husband threatened her but used no force." Sergeant Gaton asked Officer Reed where he obtained that information. Officer Reed answered, "Pretty much on the first run, well the second, not the trap house run, but the initial call to their house." Sergeant Gaton asked, "You mean the 33 run?" Officer Reed replied, "Yeah." To clarify, Sergeant Gaton asked Officer Reed if he obtained all the information in the narrative from the notes in the CAD. Officer Reed qualified his previous response and said he got some of the data from the CAD but not all of it.

Sergeant Gaton pointed out to Officer Reed the CAD didn't mention anything about threats. Officer Reed then said he wrote the part about threats being made from his "judgment." Officer Reed said none of the other officers told him Mr. Solis had threatened Ms. Saenz. Officer Reed acknowledged the information in his narrative was not within the CAD, and it came from "what he wrote on the report." Officer Reed said, "I messed up on the verbiage on the report. I was counseled by the lieutenant on why it shouldn't have been classified this, and I corrected it." Officer Reed said Lieutenant Kuykendoll corrected him because the information was inaccurate, and he voluntarily re-wrote the narrative. Officer Reed said he did not review his BWC video before writing the report.

Officer Reed said once he and Officer Coaty were at the scene, they decided to "take a report only," based upon the information they gathered and the data from the 5

precinct officers. Officer Reed said he did not believe there was a need to conduct a lethality assessment. Officer Reed said he did not ask Ms. Saenz why she wanted Mr. Solis to go to jail because her behavior was "erratic" and "she did not seem all with it."

Officer Reed said it seemed like Ms. Saenz was truthful. This investigator asked Officer Reed upon what observations he based his opinion that Ms. Saenz was truthful. Officer Reed responded, "Her irrational behavior on the first run, this run, and goes right back to it's all about the trap house." This investigator asked Officer Reed how he accounted for the discrepancy between what the run stated and what Ms. Saenz said at the scene. Officer Reed replied, "Nobody recovered a firearm that I was ever informed about or observed one; she did not say there was any violence during the little time I had, so that covers the domestic and the 33 run." This investigator asked Officer Reed if her responses seemed reasonable compared to what she had told the call taker. Officer Reed answered, "No. It wasn't anywhere near what was on the run." This investigator then asked Officer Reed why he didn't challenge Ms. Saenz about the discrepancy. Officer Reed replied, "Um, I was the second one that had contact with her. I assumed the other officers asked certain questions on their own."

This investigator asked Officer Reed if there was any point when he conferred with the other officers and asked them what questions they had asked or what information they had gotten. Officer Reed said he hadn't because he was told it was all about the trap house. Officer Reed said he didn't know the relationship between the two parties when he completed the report, but used the information in the CAD that mentioned he was her husband.

Officer Reed said the situation had been resolved when the officers left because: there were no allegations of violence, she did not make any statements about her safety, and she had the opportunity to leave the house. Officer Reed said he did not ask her any questions to determine if she felt safe in the home. Officer Reed said he did not know Ms. Saenz was crying as the officers left until he reviewed his BWC video.

Officer Reed said he did not believe there was reasonable suspicion or probable cause to believe an offense occurred. Officer Reed said he did not run Mr. Solis in LEADS or conduct a warrant check because he "did not feel the need to" and assumed the other officers conducted a warrant check. Officer Reed admitted he did not ask the other officers if they had done the checks, and they did not tell him they had. Officer Reed said he tried to run Ms. Saenz's social security number in LEADS, but it did not come back. Officer Reed said he asked Ms. Saenz a couple of times about the spelling of her name and her social security number, but the dogs were barking, and he was not sure he heard her correctly.

Officer Reed said he did not follow-up with any neighbors to see if there were any witnesses. Officer Reed said he does not regularly follow-up on gun runs with

inconsistent information. Officer Reed said he does a follow-up with neighbors if domestic violence is alleged. Officer Reed said Ms. Saenz did not qualify for Choices, and there was no violence, so she was not provided crime victim information, protection order information, or a referral to Choices. Officer Reed said there was no reason she was not provided with the report number.

Officer Reed said he did not know if anyone suggested the couple voluntarily separate for a while, but he did not. Officer Reed said he did not feel there was a need for the couple to be separated. Officer Reed said he was not aware there was a 911 hang-up for the residence after they left, so he did not respond to it. Officer Reed said there was nothing he felt he should have done that he did not do.

Officer Reed said, on July 13, 2019, he was told over the radio to report to 5 precinct substation to see Lieutenant Kuykendoll (Incident #190577029). Officer Reed said when he arrived, "she (Lieutenant Kuykendoll) pulled up this run and read it to me and then showed me my report and read that, and asked me questions like you guys have, about is there any threats of violence in this, on your run. Blah, blah, blah. And I responded, no ma'am, and then, you are absolutely right. And then she says we need to make this report exactly what you observed, so I did."

Officer Reed said Lieutenant Kuykendoll had looked at the CAD information, the report, and the BWC videos and told him it was not a domestic dispute, but a miscellaneous incident, and she wanted it changed. This investigator pointed out to Officer Reed that he knew the couple argued though and asked if he discussed that with Lieutenant Kuykendoll. Officer Reed said he explained that to her. Sergeant Gaton asked Officer Reed if he would consider a husband and wife arguing over a trap house a domestic dispute, and he replied, "No, because it is nothing to do with their relationship. It's just an argument." Sergeant Gaton pointed out to Officer Reed that Ms. Saenz said they were arguing because Mr. Solis is jealous that guys at the trap house are looking at her, and asked him again if he thought it was a domestic dispute. Officer Reed answered, "No, sir." Sergeant Gaton asked Officer Reed what would make it a domestic dispute. Officer Reed responded, "If I had knowledge of...I did not know he was actively arguing with her over that. She made the comment that he gets upset by guys looking at her from the trap house. So I had no knowledge of a prior argument." Sergeant Gaton pointed out to Officer Reed the BWC video shows he asked the woman why she and her "hubby" were fighting.

Officer Reed said when he originally completed the report, he thought it was a domestic because he "looked at the CAD and did the report." Officer Reed said he did not recall if Lieutenant Kuykendoll told him it was not a domestic dispute, but she said it should be classified as a Miscellaneous Incident. After listening to Lieutenant Kuykendoll, Officer Reed said, "It made sense that the report should be changed to a Miscellaneous (Incident)." Officer Reed said when he opened the report to revise the narrative, it had

already been changed to a Miscellaneous Incident. Officer Reed said the only thing he could write was what he observed because the other information had not been provided to him. Officer Reed said he wrote the report from his memory and did not view his BWC video or anyone else's BWC video. Officer Reed said no one told him what to write or not write in the narrative. Officer Reed said when he changed the report, he was aware Ms. Saenz had been killed the day before. Officer Reed said he did not think there would be any issues with him altering the first report, even though Ms. Saenz had been killed because he had nothing to hide. Officer Reed said he was not ordered to change the narrative.

Sergeant Gaton guestioned Officer Reed about his second narrative that stated both parties were asked several times if there had been any violence or threats, and they said there hadn't. The investigators inquired if Officer Reed asked the parties about threats or violence several times, and he admitted he had not. Sergeant Gaton asked Officer Reed "Where's that coming from then?" Officer Reed responded, "I don't recall." This investigator asked Officer Reed since he said he wrote the report off of what he observed, did he observe Mr. Solis and Ms. Saenz being repeatedly asked if Officer Reed said he did not recall. there were any threats or violence. investigator replayed Officer Reed's BWC video for him to refresh his memory and asked him the question again. Officer Reed said, "No, ma'am." This investigator asked Officer Reed why he wrote that in the report then, and Officer Reed answered, "I don't recall." This investigator asked Officer Reed what he did to ensure that the second report was more accurate than the first report. Officer Reed answered, "I rewrote it with what knowledge and memory I had." Officer Reed admitted that he could have looked at his BWC video to refresh his memory, but he didn't. Officer Reed said he had "no clue" why he didn't look at the BWC video before he rewrote the report.

This investigator asked Officer Reed if he had read Lieutenant Kuykendoll's investigative letter, and he said he had. Officer Reed confirmed the letter accurately reflected his conversation with Lieutenant Kuykendoll.

This investigator asked Officer Reed what the officers were referring to when they said to take a report to "CYA." Officer Reed said, "Always take a report." This investigator pointed out to Officer Reed that frequently with miscellaneous incidents, officers do not take a report unless a report is requested. Officer Reed replied, "I always take a report, ma'am." This investigator repeated, "You always take a report?" Officer Reed answered, "Always." This investigator asked Officer Reed if he had taken a report when he met with Ms. Saenz that morning about the trap house, and he said no because he did not have any information to make a report. This investigator asked Officer Reed if he asked Ms. Saenz for her name to take a report, and he said no. Officer Reed said when he gets dispatched, he takes a report.

This investigator asked Officer Reed when he spoke to Lieutenant Kuykendoll if there was any discussion that there could be a liability because there had not been any enforcement action, considering the way the report had been written. Officer Reed said he did not recall. Officer Reed said he did not change the report for liability reasons.

Sergeant Daugherty, Joshua S #5110 - witness officer:

On November 4, 2019, this investigator and Sergeant Gaton, interviewed Sergeant Joshua Daugherty at Police Headquarters. Sergeant Daugherty said, on July 13, 2019, Lieutenant LuEllen Kuykendoll called him, while he was working a temporary assignment as the first shift "580" sergeant, and asked him if it was possible to change a report classification. Sergeant Daugherty said he told Lieutenant Kuykendoll the heading, and the case details could be amended. Sergeant Daugherty said he then asked her for the report number.

Sergeant Daugherty said, Lieutenant Kuykendoll told him, "The whole thing needed to be changed," and "the narrative is not right." Sergeant Daugherty said Lieutenant Kuykendoll told him the officer was going to re-do the report. Sergeant Daugherty said he could not recall if he offered to change the report for Lieutenant Kuykendoll or if she told him to change it. Still, the only reason he believed he would have changed the classification from Domestic Dispute to Miscellaneous Incident would have been because Lieutenant Kuykendoll told him that was what it needed to be. Sergeant Daugherty said he had no knowledge of the run or involvement with it, and he did not know when he changed the report classification the listed victim therein had been murdered the previous day.

Sergeant Daugherty said Lieutenant Kuykendoll was the only person he spoke to regarding the report, and he believed he spoke to her only once about it. Sergeant Daugherty said he could not tell if anyone was present with Lieutenant Kuykendoll when she called.

Sergeant Daugherty said, as the "580" sergeant, people contact him from time to time with administrative questions about PremierOne, LION, and with other miscellaneous issues. Sergeant Daugherty said those tasks are part of the patrol administration sergeant's job duties, so Lieutenant Kuykendoll's inquiry about making changes to a report did not seem unusual, and "it did not raise any red flags."

Sergeant ODOM, CHRISTOPHER #5227 - witness officer:

On November 7, 2019, this investigator conducted an in-person interview with Sergeant Christopher Odom. Sergeant Odom stated that on July 13, 2019, Lieutenant LuEllen Kuykendoll came into his office at 5 precinct substation and asked him if he knew about a particular run because Deputy Chief Timothy Becker had raised some questions about

it. Sergeant Odom said he told Lieutenant Kuykendoll he vaguely knew about it. Sergeant Odom said Lieutenant Kuykendoll informed him about what had happened and provided the names of the officers involved. Sergeant Odom said he read the CAD data and the report narrative, and he and Lieutenant Kuykendoll watched the involved officers' BWC videos together. Sergeant Odom said Lieutenant Kuykendoll might have been concerned about the situation, but she handled it matter-of-factly.

Sergeant Odom stated after they reviewed the BWC videos, Lieutenant Kuykendoll asked for his opinion regarding how the officers had handled the run. Sergeant Odom stated he told her he did not believe the officers had done anything wrong, and Lieutenant Kuykendoll agreed. However, Sergeant Odom said he noticed the videos did not coincide with the one-line narrative Officer Reed had written. Sergeant Odom said he thought Lieutenant Kuykendoll told him the officers had based the narrative on information within the CAD data. Sergeant Odom said, "It was more or less, like a domestic dispute, and so forth because the victim never verbalized that she was assaulted. So, I was wondering why he did not put this in here."

Sergeant Odom said he told Lieutenant Kuykendoll that he was not sure why the officers had taken a report because no crime had been committed, and the victim continually said she had a problem with the people at the trap house and not with her boyfriend. Sergeant Odom said he believed the officers took the report to "CYA," so they would not "get dinged." Sergeant Odom said he told Lieutenant Kuykendoll that the report should have been classified as a Miscellaneous Incident and not as a Domestic Dispute. Sergeant Odom said he thought Lieutenant Kuykendoll told him she agreed with his sentiments.

Sergeant Odom said Lieutenant Kuykendoll asked him if he had checked Officer Reed's report, and he told her he had not because the officers were still working on it when his shift ended. Sergeant Odom said the report had not been "approved" and was still in progress; therefore, Officer Reed could correct mistakes within it.

Sergeant Odom said Lieutenant Kuykendoll did not divulge how she planned to address the situation or what she was going to do about the inaccurate report. Sergeant Odom said he was not aware Officer Reed came to 5 substation to meet with Lieutenant Kuykendoll about the report. Sergeant Odom said he was not present and had no information about what had transpired between them. Sergeant Odom said he did not know if Lieutenant Kuykendoll received direction from anyone else regarding how to handle the incident.

Lieutenant KUYKENDOLL, LUELLEN #5100 - focus officer:

On November 19, 2019, this investigator and Sergeant Gaton conducted an in-person interview of Lieutenant Kuykendoll. Lieutenant Kuykendoll stated she received an email

from Commander Sagle that directed her to look into the run on July 11, 2019. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she read the report and the CAD data and responded to Commander Sagle's email. Based upon the original report narrative, Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she concluded the officers should have arrested Mr. Solis on July 11, 2019. This investigator read Lieutenant Kuykendoll the email response she sent to Commander Sagle at 7:18 am, on July 13, 2019, which stated, in part, that she wanted to know how he wanted her to proceed before she spoke to anyone. This investigator then asked her if she talked to Commander Sagle before she talked to Officer Reed. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she had.

This investigator asked Lieutenant Kuykendoll if Commander Sagle told her how she was to proceed. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did not recall if Commander Sagle provided her with advice, direction, or guidance as to how to handle the situation, and she did not remember if she told Commander Sagle what she had decided to do. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said other than perhaps Commander Sagle, she did not think she received advice from anyone else on how to handle the situation. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said her communication with Commander Sagle regarding this matter was limited to email and telephone calls. Although she did not recall what was said precisely, they conversed multiple times throughout the day about the situation.

Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did not know if she watched all of the BWC videos or if she watched all the videos from start to finish. This investigator read Lieutenant Kuykendoll her letter that stated she had reviewed the BWC video from all the officers involved. This investigator again asked Lieutenant Kuykendoll if she watched all the BWC videos, and she responded that she did not remember watching the videos. This investigator asked Lieutenant Kuykendoll if she would have written in her letter on July 13, 2019, that she had watched all the BWC videos if it were untrue, and she said she would not. Lieutenant Kuykendoll then agreed it could be assumed she watched all the videos based upon what she wrote that day.

Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she watched the BWC videos before speaking to Officer Reed, and it changed her thought process from her initial assessment because what happened in the videos was not reflected in the report narrative. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said when she watched the BWC videos, it appeared the officers had responded to a gun run. Still, when they got there, they discovered there had not been any violence or even a domestic dispute. Based on the way she perceived the information at that time, Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she thought it was a miscellaneous incident and all about a trap house. After having reviewed the video numerous times since then, Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she now believed it was a domestic dispute, and she did not know why she did not initially think it was a domestic dispute. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she made a mistake when she changed the classification, but she did it based upon a quick review of the videos and not a detailed, in-depth analysis. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said,

"If things were missed, they were missed that day. My objective was to correct a report that I thought was incorrect."

Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she was told to see if opportunities to intervene had been missed. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she understood that to mean whether the officers had established probable cause, but failed to make an arrest. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did not know if Commander Sagle told her only to look to see if the officers had probable cause to arrest someone, but she was not directed to analyze the run to a high degree of detail. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did not investigate what happened, and she only spoke to Officer Reed, because she did not feel she needed to talk to the other officers to fulfill her obligation of reviewing the run. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did not take into consideration if the officers had shared all the information they had gathered at the scene. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did not conduct any review regarding the officers' response to the 911 hang-up call because she was not correlating that the 911 call was received after the officers left.

Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she called Officer Reed to her office and explained to him that she had been directed to review what happened on July 11, 2019. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she told Officer Reed that his report indicated there should have been charges filed and an arrest. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she informed Officer Reed that she had watched the BWC videos, and it did not appear they corresponded to the narrative within the report. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she asked him if the description reflected what happened, and he answered, "No." Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she asked Officer Reed where he got the information that he used to write the report narrative, and he said it was from the CAD data. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said Officer Reed told her he took the report to "CYA."

Lieutenant Kuykendoll said Officer Reed's response that the report was for "CYA" made her think it was just a miscellaneous incident. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she thought it was "a little odd" because, as an officer, she didn't take reports for "CYA" purposes. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she told Officer Reed that report narratives should not be written solely on the CAD data. To clarify the issue, Lieutenant Kuykendoll expounded to him that the CAD data can be considered when deciding on a course of action, but the report should be written based on what happened at the scene. After they discussed the matter, Lieutenant Kuykendoll said Officer Reed agreed the report narrative and classification needed to be corrected.

Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she might have determined the report needed to be corrected before she spoke to Officer Reed, but after she talked to him, it confirmed her decision, and she told Officer Reed to amend the report. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she called Sergeant Daugherty, the "580 sergeant" to assist with changing the report classification. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did not know if she discussed with Officer Reed what content should be included, but she did not instruct him on how to word the

narrative. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did not know if she told Officer Reed that he should base the narrative only on his direct observations and should not include information gathered by the other officers. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did not know how Officer Reed came up with the wording or content for the revised narrative.

Lieutenant Kuykendoll said, after Officer Reed made corrections, she checked the grammar and content of the report. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said, based upon her review that day, she thought it appeared to be a complete representation of what occurred.

This investigator asked Lieutenant Kuykendoll why she had Officer Reed change the report narrative instead of including the additional information as a ".2" document. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did not know what all her options were, but she did not consider creating a .2 document. Lieutenant Kuykendoll explained she believed ".2" documents to be for additional information, and it was her determination the report was incorrect. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said, because a supervisor had not approved the document and it was wrong, she thought correcting the narrative was the best way to resolve the error. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she believed she suggested to Officer Reed that he watch his BWC video to refresh his memory. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did not know if Officer Reed watched the BWC video before he rewrote the narrative.

Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did not know of anyone else involved with revising the report. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said the letter she wrote was accurate based upon her review that day. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did not know if she challenged Officer Reed about his statement that he had written the narrative based upon the CAD data and the fact that the narrative did not coincide with the CAD data. This investigator asked Lieutenant Kuykendoll if she saw the discrepancy between the CAD data and the narrative. Lieutenant Kuykendoll replied, "That was not my focus that day. My focus was on getting the report correct so it could be in the system." This investigator asked Lieutenant Kuykendoll again if she had noticed the inconsistency between the CAD data and the report narrative, and she answered, "I don't know."

Lieutenant Kuykendoll said after she completed her review and submitted a letter of information, no one in the Division of Police followed up with her and directed her to do more or questioned any of her actions. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she was transparent and included the original report and the revised report with her letter. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said, "I assumed there was absolutely no problems [sic] with what I did, and apparently, there wasn't, until the intent to file a lawsuit was, came to everyone's mind." Lieutenant Kuykendoll was resolute that the officers' lacked probable cause to arrest anyone at the scene, and her mind had remained unchanged after reviewing the videos again.

Commander SAGLE, ROBERT M 5013 - witness officer:

On November 20, 2019, this investigator conducted an in-person interview with Commander Robert Sagle. Commander Sagle said, on July 13, 2019, he had a few different conversations with Lieutenant Kuykendoll throughout the day. Commander Sagle said he told Lieutenant Kuykendoll he wanted her to examine if there was anything the Division could have done that would have prevented Ms. Saenz from being killed. Commander Sagle said when he first spoke to Lieutenant Kuykendoll on the phone, she indicated she had not watched the BWC videos, talked to any of the officers, or taken any further steps. Commander Sagle said he told Lieutenant Kuykendoll to watch the BWC videos and if she felt there needed to be an investigation, to proceed with an investigation. Commander Sagle said when he spoke to Lieutenant Kuykendoll later, after she watched the BWC videos, she had changed her opinion of the situation because nothing documented in the narrative had happened in the BWC videos. Commander Sagle said Lieutenant Kuykendoll indicated that she did not think the officers had probable cause to arrest anyone, based upon the BWC videos; therefore, she was proceeding with an administrative review.

Commander Sagle said he instructed Lieutenant Kuykendoll to continue to look into what happened to ensure that none of the officers had additional information that would have generated probable cause. Commander Sagle said Lieutenant Kuykendoll told him she was going to speak to Officer Reed about the incident. Later, Commander Sagle said Lieutenant Kuykendoll told him she had talked to Officer Reed, and he had indicated he wrote the report narrative from the CAD data and not from the information the officers obtained at the scene. Commander Sagle said Lieutenant Kuykendoll told him Officer Reed was correcting the report since a supervisor had not approved it. Commander Sagle said he agreed to this course of action and instructed Lieutenant Kuykendoll to document her actions in a letter of information and to send it up the chain of command.

Commander Sagle said he directed Lieutenant Kuykendoll to examine if the officers had established probable cause to arrest or file charges against Mr. Solis. Commander Sagle said when he read Lieutenant Kuykendoll's letter, it appeared to him that she had followed his directions. Commander Sagle said he was sure he spoke to Lieutenant Kuykendoll after that day about how she had resolved the situation, but he did not have any specific memory of it.

Lieutenant Kuykendoll's letter of information, with the routing sheet and all attachments, is included.

The email chain and response sent by Lieutenant Kuykendoll to Commander Sagle is included.

An email chain originated by Joel Newby III to City Attorney Zach Klein that alleged officer misconduct is included.

The email Lieutenant Kuykendoll sent to Officer Caldwell with instructions regarding Shot-Spotter Special is included.

A LEADS audit showed neither party was checked by name or social security number; it is included.

The CAD data for Incident #190570555 (10-33), 190573405 (10-43), 190570286, (10-48A) and 190577029 (10-23) are included.

The CAD data from #190570555, on July 11, 2019, stated "<> (between) caller and her husband who assaulted her. Marco MH (male Hispanic) wearing all BLK (black); there are 2 33's (guns) inside the house. Caller yelled that he has 33's (guns) in hand. Heard a loud scream then line DISC (disconnected). VMOCB (Voicemail on call-back)" At 1:33 pm, a second 911 call was received from the same number Ms. Saenz had used to call the police to report the trap house earlier in the day and when she called about the gun run. It was added to the 33 run as a duplicate call, and notes were added that stated, "34B (911 hang-up call) from this # (number). NAOCB (no answer on call-back)."

The CAD data from #190573405, on July 12, 2019, showed the run was aired at 9:55 am and Officer Reed responded. The notes on the run indicated Mr. Solis admitted to the call taker he shot Ms. Saenz and that she was pronounced deceased at 10:59 am.

The CAD data from #190570286, on July 11, 2019, showed Officer Reed responded to it the same day as the gun run. Ms. Saenz did not provide her name to the call taker. The CAD data indicated the caller saw people loading things into a burgundy SUV with Kentucky license plates at a trap house. No report was taken.

The CAD data from #190577029, on July 13, 2019, showed Officer Reed was busy at the 5 precinct substation from 11:40 am to 1:17 pm, when he met with Lieutenant Kuykendoll and changed the report narrative.

The Event Information and Chronologies for #190570555 and #190570286 are included.

A BWC video audit was conducted to determine who watched the BWC videos and when the videos were watched. The initial report did not specify the time the video

was accessed, but a report, which included the time, was provided after all the interviews were completed. Both sets of reports are included. The second report showed Officer Reed accessed his BWC video on July 13, 2019, at 7:37 am. Sergeant Odom accessed Officer Reed's video at 9:41 am and again at 10:11 am. Lieutenant Kuykendoll did not personally access Officer Reed's BWC video on July 13, 2019.

A PremierOne audit was conducted to examine all the activities related to Report #190570555. The examination showed Officer Reed checked in the initial report on July 11, 2019, at 1:39 pm. On July 12, 2019, at 10:08 am, Officer Reed viewed the report. That same day, at 10:11 am, Officer Coaty viewed the report, and at 10:19 am, Officer Caldwell viewed the report. On July 13, 2019, at 7:13 am, Lieutenant Kuykendoll viewed the report, and Sergeant Odom first viewed the report at 10:28 am. Between 12:11 pm and 12:14 pm, Sergeant Daugherty accessed the report and changed the classification from Domestic Dispute to Miscellaneous Incident. From 12:25 pm to 12:47 pm, Officer Reed revised the narrative, and from 12:54 pm to 1:04 pm, Lieutenant Kuykendoll revised the narrative. The audit is included.

The cruiser GPS records, which showed when the officers were at scene and when they left, are included. The location is captured in two minute increments. Therefore, it does not show the exact time the officers left but is accurate within 2 minutes.

The first report submitted by Officer Reed and the revised report are included.

Mr. Solis' Mugshot records and CCH are included. His CCH indicated he had prior convictions for Felonious Assault, CCW, and Possession of Weapons under Disability. The arrest information within mugshots listed prior arrests for Felonious Assault, Possession of Heroin, and Possession of Drugs (type not specified).

Recordings of the radio traffic and 911 calls are included.

Copies of the BWC videos are included. This investigator reviewed the videos and typed transcripts, which are also included.

Transcripts of all the interviews are being typed and will be available at a later date.

Investigator's Comments

The evidence that showed Officer Reed accessed his BWC video on July 13, 2019, before revising the narrative, did not become available until after his interview. By the time the information was obtained, Officer Reed was not available for an interview due to an extended injury leave. The evidence appeared to contradict Officer Reed's statement.

The BWC audit showed Commander Sagle had not accessed any of the BWC videos when he concurred with Lieutenant Kuykendoll on the routing sheet on July 22, 2019. Copies of the BWC videos were not included with Lieutenant Kuykendoll's letter, and the videos were not downloaded by anyone until August 9, 2019. Therefore, he could not have viewed a copy of the videos.

Cruiser GPS data reflected all the officers left the area before the 911 hang-up call was received. The additional information was added to the CAD data but the dispatcher did not air it. Consequently, none of the officers were aware of the 911 call and it received no police response. The dispatcher's actions were investigated and documented separately.

FOP Assistant Grievance Chair John Davis granted an extension on this case until December 20, 2019.

Investigator's Recommendation of Finding

Allegation I

Officer Matthew Caldwell failed to share relevant information with other officers.

Officer Caldwell was the first officer to arrive at the scene. Officer Caldwell said he was working Shot-Spotter Special and had been instructed not to volunteer for dispatched runs and to remain available to respond when gunshots were reported. An email from Lieutenant Kuykendoll to Officer Caldwell corroborated that he had received those directions. For that reason, Officer Caldwell said he assisted as a cover officer. Officer Caldwell stated he briefly spoke to Ms. Saenz through the window and never spoke with Mr. Solis.

As a cover officer, Officer Caldwell assessed the scene, looked for weapons, and looked for other individuals who might be a threat to the officers. Officer Caldwell noted the front window was broken, there was glass on the floor, and an open empty gun case was on the bed. As he scanned the area, Officer Caldwell said he did not observe a gun, any injuries on either party or the damaged drywall. The BWC video and Officer Caldwell's statement confirmed he told Officer Eagon about the gun case, but did not tell anyone else. Officer Caldwell said he now realized he should have asked Ms. Saenz where the gun was.

Officer Eagon was one of the officers who interviewed Ms. Saenz and had an active role in the investigation and Officer Caldwell was not. Cover officers do not typically join

into interviews, but are not prevented from asking questions either. Since Officer Caldwell immediately announced he had found a gun, but then said it was only an empty case, he fulfilled his role as a cover officer. Once Officer Eagon, who was conducting the investigation knew about the gun case, Officer Caldwell had fulfilled his duty to share the information.

Officer Caldwell was not responsible to share information about his observation with the remainder of the officers. The allegation is refuted by a preponderance of the evidence, and this investigator recommends a finding of Unfounded.

Allegation I

Officer Todd Eagon failed to share relevant information with other officers.

Officer Eagon was the first officer to speak to Ms. Saenz after the parties were separated. Officer Eagon asked Ms. Saenz what happened, and she answered, "He wouldn't let me inside the house, and I broke the window. I broke the window. I shouldn't have broke it [sic], but like, I wanted to get inside the house to protect the dogs." Ms. Saenz told Officer Eagon that she was afraid of Mr. Solis and sobbed.

When Officer Reed came inside, Officer Eagon relayed to him that Ms. Saenz had told him nothing had happened, and she was just upset about the trap house. Officer Eagon did not share with Officer Reed or the other officers Ms. Saenz's statements about being afraid of Mr. Solis, that he had locked her out of the house, and that she had broken the window to protect the dogs. Officer Eagon said he did not share the information with Officer Reed because he assumed Ms. Saenz would tell Officer Reed more information than she told him. When Officer Reed asked Officer Eagon if there had been domestic violence, Officer Eagon told him no. Officer Eagon said Officer Caldwell made him aware of the gun case, but he did not mention it to any of the officers who were conducting the investigation.

Officer Eagon said the officers did not confer with one another to establish what all evidence they had obtained. The lapse in communication resulted in the officers prematurely concluding that a domestic violence offense had not occurred. Rule of Conduct 1.15 A4 states, "Division personnel shall coordinate their efforts in order to attain the goals of the Division of Police." Further, Columbus Police Field Report Manual 1.02 II.D. states, "Personnel completing an incident report shall observe and document all relevant conditions, events, and remarks made." Officer Eagon's failure to share information with the other officers regarding Ms. Saenz's statements and the open gun case impeded the other officers' ability to investigate a possible incident of domestic violence and complete a thorough and accurate report. A preponderance of the

evidence supports the alleged misconduct, and this investigator recommends a finding of Sustained.

Allegation II

Officer Sean Noltemeyer failed to complete a proper investigation.

Officer Noltemeyer arrived at the scene with Officer Eagon. Upon contact with Ms. Saenz, Officer Noltemeyer inquired about the location of Mr. Solis and obtained consent to enter the residence. Officer Noltemeyer explained that because of the nature of the run, he was concerned for everyone's safety. Officer Noltemeyer said he was preoccupied, thinking about the possibility of a gunfight with Mr. Solis, so he did not process everything Ms. Saenz told them initially.

After he made contact with Mr. Solis, Officer Noltemeyer said he immediately patted him down for weapons. Officer Noltemeyer said the officers separated the two parties, and he remained with Mr. Solis. Officer Noltemeyer said he obtained Mr. Solis' information, looked at him for indicators of a physical altercation, and noted his tattoos for later reference. Officer Noltemeyer said he did not conduct a LEADS or warrant check, but provided the information to Officer Coaty and assumed he would take care of it. Officer Noltemeyer noted he had difficulty hearing Mr. Solis because he mumbled and spoke softly.

Officer Noltemeyer said he did not question Mr. Solis about the gun because he thought it could be considered a custodial interrogation due to the presence of multiple officers and that Mr. Solis was not free to leave while they were investigating. Officer Noltemeyer said he relied on Officer Eagon and Officer Reed to gather the necessary information from Ms. Saenz to determine if a crime had occurred and what further steps needed to be taken with Mr. Solis. Officer Noltemeyer said when Officer Eagon told him there had not been any domestic violence and she had just called about the trap house, he shared with Officer Eagon that Mr. Solis had admitted to staying out all night, which had sparked an argument with Ms. Saenz.

Officer Noltemeyer acted in good faith that Officer Reed and Officer Eagon had adequately investigated the incident when they determined no crime was being alleged or had been committed. Although Officer Noltemeyer did not conduct a LEADS or warrant check, he provided the information to Officer Coaty, with the belief that one of the precinct officers was going to complete the report. Officer Noltemeyer did not know about the statements Ms. Saenz had made or the presence of an open gun case. Officer Noltemeyer's investigative actions were reasonable and he communicated the information he thought was important to Officer Reed. A preponderance of the

evidence refutes the alleged misconduct, and this investigator recommends the allegation is classified as Unfounded.

Allegation II

Officer John Coaty failed to complete a proper investigation.

Officer Coaty arrived after the other officers, and he served as a cover officer. Officer Coaty did not enter the residence or speak to Ms. Saenz. He said he remained with Mr. Solis because he assumed if the officers were going to make an arrest, it would probably be Mr. Solis. Officer Coaty volunteered to complete a police report, but Officer Reed said he would do it since Officer Coaty already had other reports to finish.

Like Officer Noltemeyer, Officer Coaty acted in good faith that Officer Reed and Officer Eagon had adequately investigated the incident when they determined no crime was being alleged or had been committed. Officer Coaty did not conduct a LEADS or warrant check on Mr. Solis and assumed the checks had already been done before he arrived. Officer Coaty did not know about the statements Ms. Saenz had made or the presence of an open gun case. Officer Coaty's actions were reasonable, and a preponderance of the evidence refutes the alleged misconduct. This investigator recommends the allegation is classified as Unfounded.

Allegation II

Officer Rodney Reed failed to complete a proper investigation.

When Officer Reed arrived, Officer Eagon was already speaking to Ms. Saenz inside the residence. After Officer Reed determined who the caller was, he told the other officers that she was mentally ill. Officer Reed said he surmised Ms. Saenz was mentally ill from his one prior encounter with her because she was hysterical, not functioning in a usual way, overly dramatic, and insistent that the officers do something immediately about a trap house.

Officer Reed informally assumed the leading role in the investigation and entered the residence to interview Ms. Saenz. Officers Noltemeyer and Eagon both conveyed to Officer Reed that Ms. Saenz claimed she called about a trap house. This information coincided with Officer Reed's previous conversation with her. Although the initial comments on the run stated the caller alleged she had been assaulted and her husband had a gun, Officer Reed did not ask Ms. Saenz about the weapon, if she had been

threatened, or if any violence had occurred. Ms. Saenz made statements to Officer Reed that Mr. Solis "gets mad" and is jealous when he thinks that other guys are looking at her. She also told him that they argued. Ms. Saenz did not divulge anything further to Officer Reed about what had just happened, and he did not prod her to share additional information regarding Mr. Solis' specific conduct that day. Ms. Saenz told Officer Reed, "...he's (Mr. Solis) this and he's that," but Officer Reed did not ask Ms. Saenz to elaborate or clarify what she meant.

Officer Reed said he did not notice that the front window was broken. Officer Reed said he did not see any injuries on either party. The BWC shows neither party alleged they were injured; however, Ms. Saenz appeared to have old bruises on her arms (Officer Reed's BWC video, 3:36), and Mr. Solis appeared to have a fresh scrape on his chest (Officer Eagon's BWC video, 2:51). Ms. Saenz was asked privately by Officer Eagon what happened, and she did not say she had been assaulted or threatened. Also, Officer Eagon did not reveal to Officer Reed that Ms. Saenz told him she was afraid of Mr. Solis and that he had locked her out of the house, so she broke the window to protect the dogs.

Officer Reed did ask Officer Eagon, "So no 17?" and Officer Eagon replied, "No." Officer Eagon's answer swayed Officer Reed to believe that there was no evidence a domestic violence offense had occurred. Rule of Conduct 1.15 A4 states, "Division personnel shall coordinate their efforts to attain the goals of the Division of Police." Columbus Police Field Report Manual 1.02 II.D. states, "Personnel completing an incident report shall observe and document all relevant conditions, events, and remarks made." Although he gained some information from Officer Noltemeyer and Officer Eagon, Officer Reed did not coordinate his investigative actions with the actions of the other officers in a satisfactory manner. As the officer leading the investigation, he decided to complete a report and clear the run without conferencing with the other officers to ensure the officers had asked the essential questions to both of the parties, and those questions had been answered. These questions included asking about the gun, if anyone had been threatened, and if any violence had occurred. Officer Reed also did not provide Ms. Saenz with the report number. A preponderance of the evidence supports the allegation, and this investigator recommends a finding of Sustained.

Allegation III

Lieutenant LuEllen Kuykendoll instructed Officer Rodney Reed to amend Report #190570555, which was completed.

On July 13, 2019, Lieutenant Kuykendoll watched the BWC videos and believed the narrative for Report #190570555 did not reflect what occurred. The report had not

been reviewed by a supervisor, which allowed it to be amended. She then met with Officer Reed and discussed it with him. Officer Reed told Lieutenant Kuykendoll he had written the narrative based on the CAD data and not on what the parties stated at the scene. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she directed Officer Reed to rewrite the narrative because it was not correct.

Columbus Police Field Report Manual 1.01 III.C. states, "Supervisors shall require officers to revise Incident Reports that do not meet the guidelines." Because the narrative was not accurate, the report did not adhere to the guidelines within the Columbus Police Field Report Manual. Namely, section 1.01 II. B., which states, "Reports are to be complete, concise, and accurate, answering the basic questions of who, what, when, where, why, and how." Lieutenant Kuykendoll's guidance to Officer Reed to correct the error was proper and lawful. The evidence indicates the conduct occurred, was not a violation of law or Division policy, and no misconduct was substantiated. The allegation is recommended to be classified as Exonerated.

Allegation IV

Officer Rodney Reed added inaccurate information to a police report.

During his Internal Affairs Bureau interview, Officer Reed stated he wrote the first report narrative based upon information provided in the CAD. Officer Reed provided that same statement to Lieutenant Kuykendoll when she spoke to him on July 13, 2019. The IAB investigators pointed out to Officer Reed that the CAD data was inconsistent with his narrative. Officer Reed then said he got the information from "here" and pointed to his head. Officer Reed said after he and Lieutenant Kuykendoll discussed his report narrative and reviewed the CAD data, he realized the information was inaccurate. Lieutenant Kuykendoll stated she told Officer Reed to correct the narrative, and she believed she told him to watch his BWC video.

Officer Reed stated he had no idea why he did not watch his BWC video before he rewrote the narrative, and he could have watched it to refresh his memory, but he chose not to view it. After being tasked with correcting the narrative, Officer Reed then added information to it that was inaccurate. Officer Reed said he wrote the second report narrative from his memory, and only included information that he had personally observed because nothing else was provided to him. Officer Reed also stated he was not instructed about how to word the narrative or what information to include.

Officer Reed changed the narrative and wrote, "The caller and her husband were asked on several different occasions if there were any threats of violence or assault to either

The IAB investigators reviewed Officer Reed's BWC video with him, and Officer Reed admitted that neither party had been asked about threats or violence. This investigator asked Officer Reed where he got that information then, and Officer Reed answered that he did not recall. The report also stated Officer Reed had contact with Ms. Saenz the day before the gun run, on July 10, 2019, but CAD data showed Officer Reed's prior contact with Ms. Saenz occurred just hours before, on July 11, 2019.

Officer Reed acknowledged he was aware of Ms. Saenz's death at the time he revised the first narrative. He also said Lieutenant Kuykendoll pointed out to him that based upon what he wrote in the original narrative, Mr. Solis should have been arrested. The inaccurate information Officer Reed placed in the report narrative helped to establish that the alleged incident was thoroughly investigated, and no probable cause existed to arrest Mr. Solis. Columbus Police Field Report Manual 1.01 II. B. states, "Reports are to be complete, concise, and accurate, answering the basic questions of who, what, when, where, why, and how." A preponderance of the evidence supports the alleged misconduct occurred, and this investigator recommends the allegation is classified as Sustained.

Allegation V

Lieutenant Luellen Kuykendoll incorrectly reclassified a report.

Lieutenant Kuykendoll contacted Sergeant Daugherty and had him change the report from a Domestic Dispute, No Violence classification to a Miscellaneous Incident. During her IAB interview, Lieutenant Kuykendoll stated the way she perceived the information at that time, she thought it as a miscellaneous incident and all about a trap house. After having reviewed the video numerous times since then, Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she now believed it was a domestic dispute, and she did not know why she did not initially think it was a domestic dispute. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she made a mistake when she changed the classification, but she did it based upon a quick review of the video and not a detailed, in-depth analysis.

Columbus Police Field Report Manual 1.02 II. C. states, "All incident reports shall be properly classified according to the Ohio Revised Code and shall be detailed and accurate." ORC 3113.32 (A) mandates the chief of police of a city to keep records of domestic disputes and to submit the statistical data to the bureau of criminal identification and investigation monthly. Based on the information Ms. Saenz and Mr. Solis provided, they had a domestic dispute. Therefore, the classification should not have been changed. A preponderance of the evidence supports the alleged misconduct, and this investigator recommends the allegation is classified as Sustained.

Allegation VI

Lieutenant LuEllen Kuykendoll failed to ensure the report Officer Rodney Reed completed was accurate.

Lieutenant Kuykendoll stated she reviewed all the BWC videos on July 13, 2019, before she met with Officer Reed. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said after Officer Reed revised the narrative, she checked the grammar and content. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said based upon her review that day, she thought the revised report appeared to be a complete representation of what occurred. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said she did a quick review of the video and not a detailed, in-depth analysis. Lieutenant Kuykendoll said, "If things were missed, they were missed that day. My objective was to correct a report that I thought was incorrect."

Columbus Police Field Report Manual 1.01 III.C. states, "Supervisors shall require officers to revise Incident Reports that do not meet the guidelines." Lieutenant Kuykendoll had reviewed the BWC videos and was familiar with what happened. The BWC videos showed the parties were not asked several times if there had been any threats or violence, and consequently, they did not repeatedly deny that any threats or violence had occurred. Because the report still did not meet the guideline established in Field Report Manual 1.01 II. B., which states, "Reports are to be complete, concise, and accurate, answering the basic questions of who, what, when, where, why, and how," Lieutenant Kuykendoll should have instructed Officer Reed to correct it again. A preponderance of the evidence supports the alleged misconduct, and this investigator recommends the allegation is classified as Sustained.

On Friday, July 12, 2019, I received an email from Commander Robert Sagle #5013, C4, regarding the recent homicide at 1667 Genessee Avenue, Incident #190573405. Deputy Chief Timothy Becker #5007, Criminal Investigations Deputy Chief, advised that Patrol officers had been to the location of the shooting the day before, Thursday, July 11, 2019, Incident #190570555. Chief Becker suggested the run be reviewed to determine if opportunities to intervene had been missed. Commander Sagle directed me to look into the run.

I reviewed the PremierOne report, Incident #190570555, which was completed by Officer Rodney Reed #363, 2A9. The report was classified as Domestic Dispute (NO Violence), and the report had not yet been approved by a supervisor. The narrative on the Administrative page stated, "R/P states on the above date and time her husband had threaten[sic] her but used no force." There were no charges filed and no arrest was made.

I reviewed the BWC videos from the officers that responded to the run. The videos clearly show that several officers asked the caller, identified as Debbra Solis, the reason for the call to police and what had happened. She replied several times that she was calling to report a nearby "trap" house. Officers specifically asked her if she was calling about Marco and if anything had happened between him and her. She replied that Marco had not done anything and that she was scared of the people from the "trap" house. Attached is the Incident Video Review, form U-10.197.

After reviewing the videos, I spoke with Officer Reed regarding the report narrative. He stated he thought it was appropriate to document the run and that he based his report narrative on the information on the CAD. We discussed the fact that at no time during

the run did Ms. Solis claim any type of domestic violence or dispute, and that officers are not to take a report based solely on the CAD information. Officer Reed was receptive to our discussion and realized his mistake, though his intentions were good. Officer Reed corrected the report to reflect what occurred during the run, and the classification was changed to Miscellaneous Incident.

During my review of the BWC videos, I found that Officer John Coaty #2224, 2A2, did not have his BWC activated during this run. His BWC was activated seven times during the July 11th tour of duty. I forwarded this information to Officer Coaty's immediate supervisor, Sergeant Timothy Balmert #5103, S2A, to address with Officer Coaty.

Conclusion:

The run to 1667 Genessee Avenue on Thursday, July 11, 2019, was coded as a gun run. Information on the run indicated the caller, Ms. Solis, had been assaulted by her husband and that he had two guns inside the house. Based on my review of the response by the Zone 4 A Company officers, I find their actions to be appropriate based on the information relayed to them by the caller. The officers separated the parties and asked the caller specific questions to determine that no violence had occurred.

It is extremely unfortunate what occurred the following day. However, excluding the report classification and narrative, the officers followed Division policy and law during their response to the location the day before. I find no misconduct by the involved officers and recommend no further action.

Zach,

We have been retained by Luzy Saenz, the mother of Deborah Saenz. On July 12, 2019, Deborah was shot and killed by her boyfriend, Marcos Solis III, in the apartment in which they both resided, less than 24 hours after she made a 911 call reporting she was a victim of domestic violence. During the call, she identified Mr. Solis as the person who caused her harm. Luzy Saenz wants to file a wrongful death lawsuit against the City of Columbus seeking compensation for the death of Deborah based on a wanton disregard of police duty. The family already requested the video footage from the CPD body cams and the 911 calls. We have reviewed them. We believe there is a good faith claim and we have a solid argument around a claim of immunity. We would like to schedule a meeting to further discuss this matter and review the 911 call and body cam video with you before a lawsuit is filed. The 911 call and body cam footage can be summarized as follows:

On July 11, 2019, Deborah Saenz, called the police regarding domestic violence. She was in a panic and told the dispatcher Mr. Solis was beating her. Deborah explained in the call that Mr. Solis had guns in the house. Once the officers arrive on the scene, the body camera shows a broken window in the front. The officer is pointing his gun with a light to clear the front room. Eventually, Deborah appears in the door before the officers. They clear her from the door. They ask if she was the person that called about the gun. She doesn't deny, but says she called about the "trap house" down the road. The officers then ask about who is in the apartment. Deborah informed the officers that Mr. Solis was inside. The officers opened the door with permission from Deborah. Eventually, Mr. Solis came to the door. He was wearing only shorts and the officers patted him down. Mr. Solis sat on the picnic table located right outside of the apartment.

Inside the apartment the video is purposely blurred. It is my assumption this is due to the ongoing investigation for the upcoming criminal trial for Mr. Solis. There is still audio on the video. The officer is doing some sort of general sweep because he notes a "33" (gun) on the bed. Several seconds later he says, "its just magazines." He asks Deborah about the reason for the 911 call. Deborah talks about the trap house down the road. She states that the argument between her and Mr. Solis began when they drove past the house. Apparently, the guys at the trap house were looking at her. The officer asks, "are you scared of him?" Deborah answers, "yes." Deborah continues on about the trap house. The Officer asks, "so Marco didn't do anything?" Deborah states, "no he didn't." The officer asks if she is scared of the trap house. She says yes, she is scared of the trap house. The officer asks why? Deborah states that she fears the trap house because the guys there might try to get Mr. Solis. She states that Mr. Solis just got out of prison three months earlier. The officers repeat to a room of three officers and Deborah that nothing happened "today." The officer's conversation goes: "Nothing here today?" "Nothing here." It is unclear if they are referencing a domestic violence or a gun. One officer states, "well... it's just magazines."

Another officer enters the apartment and asks Deborah, "remember me?" It appears that he visited the apartment another time regarding the trap house and Deborah's concerns about the house. The officers state how this call was about the trap house. They do ask why this house makes Mr. Solis mad. Deborah says that it is because it makes him jealous due to the guys at the trap house looking at her. The officer and Deborah agree to a plan to avoid the trap house by not traveling in front of the trap house. Deborah asks if she can take her dog outside and the officer states that she can. She then asks the officer not to take Mr. Solis to jail. The officer states the they are not taking him to jail as far as he knows, but a report will need to be done "just to cover our rear." This is when Deborah clearly asks them to take him to jail anyway. The officer responds with "no, no, no, what's your social security number."

Once outside the officer states that the plan going forward is to avoid the trap house. Mr. Solis agrees to the plan. The five (5) officers on the scene then leave. All five (5) officers walk past Ms. Saenz while she is noticeably crying. Not one officer seemed concerned or asked why she was crying if the trap house issue had been resolved. The total time of the police visit is about nine minutes. Less than 24 hours later, Mr. Solis shot and killed Deborah.

During the entire time they were present, the officers asked no questions of Deborah about domestic violence or what prompted her 911 call. No lethality screening questions were asked. Not one officer asked her if Mr. Solis hit her. Not one officer asked why her 911 call contradicted her current story about the trap house. No action was taken with Mr. Solis despite the fact he was just released from prison and there were magazines easily accessible on the bed and Deborah told the officers in the apartment she was scared and wanted him taken to jail.

We would very much appreciate being given an opportunity to discuss with you the manner in which the officers handled the domestic violence call made by Deborah and discuss what, if any, alternatives there might be to the filing of a wrongful death lawsuit against the City of Columbus. I have CC'd my boss and the other attorney on this file.

All,

The test firing for ShotSpotter was conducted yesterday, so we are within a week of going live on Zone 4. It may be a week, or it could be tomorrow. We will be notified of the exact date, but with little to no notice.

Attached is the plan for Zone 4's response to ShotSpotter alerts, which closely resembles the plan being used by Zone 3 and includes requirements set in place by DC Bash.

With such little notice, you will need to review the plan and forward it to all of your officers. Though this will mainly effect those officers assigned to 2 and 5 Precincts, everyone on the zone needs to be familiar with our response. Additionally, everyone working on Zone 4 is required to be logged into ShotSpotter during their shifts. Apparently this was a little problematic on Zone 3 and discipline was discussed, so I want to make sure that everyone knows it is required. Everyone should have completed the training and have the ability to log into ShotSpotter. If that is not the case, please start now to identify those who need to complete the training and have them get it done.

Whether we are live or not, the project will start Sunday, February 24, 2019. There will be four officers assigned to DMW from EMW and 2nd Shift to work as the ShotSpotter response car. Sergeant Shaffer will supervise them and ensure they are trained. They will only be responding to ShotSpotter alerts unless there is an exigent incident to which they need to respond. They will not be taking routine calls for service or picking up runs. They will be marking in as SPOT4A. Please do not direct, request or volunteer them for runs. The officers working the first 30-day temp are:

E. Prime and M. Holley - WTF

E. Taylor and C. Banks - SMT

We will do our best to meet all requirements of the plan, and though the response car will be tasked with the majority of the work associated with ShotSpotter alerts, Patrol officers may be tasked with some of the response as needed. We will all work together to make this project successful for Zone 4.

The caller and husband were asked on several different occasions if there were any threats of violence or assault to either of them, and they said there was no violence or threats each time they were asked. Officer Reed asked the husband as he was leaving if his wife was on any medications and was told she was on Xanax and lots of alcohol. Officers determined that there were no threats of violence or any domestic dispute that had taken place based on the statements of both parties.

Officer Reed had a previous contact with the caller the day before when she called a run in at the "trap" house, and she was extremely concerned with the activities and wanted something done right now. Officer Reed was unable to determined if the caller was high on narcotics and or alcohol on both occasions.

1:25 Officer Caldwell is talking to someone through the window.

1:38 Officer Caldwell: You need to come to the front door!

1:58 Officer Noltemeyer: Is he in there?

2:01 Officer Noltemeyer: Where's Marco?

2:01 Ms. Saenz: He's inside. (Presses lips together)

2:02 Officer Noltemeyer: Step over here.

2:03 Ms. Saenz: I'm sorry?

2:04 Officer Noltemeyer: Step over this way.

2:07 (two officers talking) Officer Eagon: Everything alright? And Officer

Noltemeyer: Marco isn't around?

2:17 Officer Noltemeyer: Oh, ok.

2:27 Ms. Saenz: Inaudible

2:29 Officer Noltemeyer: No, is your door unlocked?

2:34 Officer Eagon: You weren't hit by Marco or anything like that?

2:55 Mr. Solis appears to have a fresh scratch below his right nipple.

3:01 Ms. Saenz: I guess. (Enters the residence holding one dog and calls her other dog back into the house)
